

## Our learning this term

Our topic this term is Ancient Greece. We will be exploring how this civilisation grew, its traditions and culture as well as the way it has shaped the world in which we live today. We are very excited to be holding an 'Ancient Greek' day later in the term! Stay tuned for more updates!



The topic theme is carried through our English lessons as we read part of the fantastic story 'Who Let The Gods Out?' by Maz Evans. The children will also be using putting Athenian democracy to good use in a persuasive piece of writing.

In mathematics this term, the Year 5 children will be focusing on developing their understanding of decimals whilst the Year 6 children will be focused on shape, problem solving and time.

In science, Mrs Rhodes will be teaching the children about materials and how these can be manipulated resulting in a change in their properties.

Finally, in RE we will explore the Easter story and how we can learn about forgiveness and new beginnings. We will be finishing the term with our Pentecost and Mission unit.
