**Escape room** - this activity is based on an escape room. The children must read through the English based clues and solve the puzzles to exit the room. I have included the clues, an answer sheet and the answers.

**CAFOD** - I have included a CAFOD colouring sheet for the children to complete. The sheet asks children to consider a quote from St Oscar Romero and think about the type of person they want to be. If you do not have a printer or a home learning pack, the children could design and colour their own image.

**Message in a bottle** - children can use the prompt to write a story about a person who writes a message in a bottle or the person who finds it.

**Nature photo frames** - a lovely outdoor activity which takes children on a nature walk to collect sticks, twigs, leaves, stones etc to make a photo frame.

**Dream summer art** - an opportunity for children to consider their dream summer activity, which they can then draw in a sunglasses template.

I hope you all enjoy the activities and most importantly I hope you all have an amazing, restful summer.
