#### How to help your child make faster progress

A recent study by the Education Endowment Foundation (EEF) found that children who attended a breakfast club, on average, achieved an additional 2 months progress. Why? Well we all know that eating breakfast is essential if children are to be in a good place to learn, but what if you prefer to eat at home? The EEF suggests that even children who don't eat the breakfast provided, still benefit from attending the club as behaviour improves and children are better prepared to learn... 
